

Joint School Mentorship Programme
“Communication – Short Circuited?” dated 17th April 2010

Co-organized with Marymount Secondary School Alumnae Association (MSSAA), the activity served as a platform for sharing experience and practical skills in communication from our alumnae. Some 100 students, fresh graduates and their respective mentors participated in the event which was held at the school hall of Wah Yan College..

Right after the kick-off speeches delivered by principals from both schools, the first half of seminar was featured by several scenes of role play covering different stages of life – secondary school to university, university to job seeking and working in the society. Participants were encouraged to comment on and make “better” suggestions in perfecting communications with one another in different situations.

The second half of the program was in form of career-specific discussions in which mentees and mentors were free to sit into smaller groups to ensure a closer interaction among themselves across generations.

Further discussions among mentees and mentors continued after the event formally ended at 18:30.
